New provisions for tax forms

OTTAWA — Man. farmers should keep in mind several new provisions to the income tax regulations when filling out their 1978 tax returns.

The most important of these is the "roll-over" provision for incorporated farms and partnerships. As of April 10, 1978, a farmer can transfer shares in a qualifying incorporated farm or farm partnership to his children, grandchildren or great grandchildren free of capital gains tax.

In the same way, a farmer ow can transfer agricultural uotas to his children during is lifetime and defer paying acome tax on an eligible apital gain until the quota is old outside the family.




